

The Impact of the Pandemic

After more than two years defined by COVID-19 restrictions, such as working from home, curtailed social and family lives, and travel bans, most organizations have had to make some adjustments in order to cope with the impact of the pandemic. Paws In Need is no different.

As a result of this "new normal," our organization continues to experience barriers to securing veterinary appointments and, in many cases, long delays in scheduling these appointments. To address these challenges, Paws In Need has ventured outside of our local Tri-Valley area to locate new veterinary providers willing to take on some of our cases. This scenario means that pet owners may have a longer drive to obtain services needed, which in turn, may increase the costs they incur.

Holly was found outside living in a feral colony by a Good Samaritan cat lover. Knowing right away she didn't belong there, Read more...








6 Doggy Sleeping Positions That Tell Us A Lot About Our Beloved Pup

This is an excerpt from the article written by Giovanna Boldrini and published Aug 3, 2021.

1. The Side Sleeper (Bottom Left)

If your pooch tends to sleep on the side, it means that they're incredibly comfortable with their surroundings, are secure with themselves, and are in no way high-maintenance. And though your dog may be guarded and alert when awake, she feels blessed to be in your home and company, and has an enormous sense of trust in you. Dogs who sleep in this position tend to be happy-go-lucky and fiercely loyal.

2. The Snuggly Fox (Top Right)

The curled-up position is probably the most common. Their paws will be comfortably tucked away under their bodies, and the tails will wrap all the way round till it touches the face.

By curling up, your dog is naturally conserving her body heat and protecting her limbs, face, throat, and all vital organs, according to BowWow Times.

Dogs who sleep in this position are gentle, easy-going, and have a naturally sweet disposition.

3. The 'Superman' Pup (Top Center)

Many dogs sleep on their stomachs, but the "super" pups are probably the most adorable of them all. With all of their four limbs stretched out and heads level on the ground, they look like they're flying through the air.

This position makes it easy for pups to spring up and get moving, as soon as you call them, or as soon as they've woken up, according to Dog's Best Life.

Pups who sleep in this position are super high-energy and very easily motivated.

4. The Crazy Legs (Top Left)

Even though this position looks slightly odd, it's nothing to be concerned about — this just means that they're very confident and secure with themselves, and with their home environment.

This makes sense *especially* since sleeping on the back translates into being the most vulnerable position for a dog. You'll most likely never see wolves sleeping on their backs in the wild, as this sends a message of vulnerability and submission, according to NextGen Dog.

5. The Tummy Curl (Bottom Center)

Dogs that sleep in this position may not be as relaxed, since the muscles are still too tense to enable them to drift into the REM stage of sleep, according to Dog's Best Life. Don't worry, though — this doesn't mean that your pup isn't relaxed in real life. In fact, they may even be the more energetic, adventurous ones in the pack, ready for action and fun at all times!

Pooches who curl up on their tummies while they sleep tend to be very gentle, but slightly timid and shy.

6. The Passed Out (Bottom Right)

Many dogs who sleep indoors opt for this "passed out" position. A dog will lie on its back in order to help themselves cool down as quickly and efficiently as possible. Most of the time, dogs who have expended lots of energy during the day, or who are overheated, will sleep flat on their backs.

In addition, really happy, secure, and relaxed dogs will tilt their legs in the air during their sleep.

Dogs who sleep in this position are highly confident in themselves, and they also tend to be very adaptable to different and new situations.
