

A Vet's Perspective on Pet Insurance

In the midst of a medical crisis, worrying about finances is the last thing that anyone wants to deal with. When it comes to our pets, we want to make sure they are healthy, happy, and back to normal as soon as possible. Covering the cost of a life-saving surgery can add to the stress of the situation for an owner very much. It can be very hard on the veterinarian as well, who has most likely entered the field because of their love of animals and are caused an immense amount of pain when they cannot effectively treat them. Doctor Barry Kipperman, DVM, DACVIM is a strong supporter and partner of Paws In Need and he has traveled the country educating people on the benefits of pet insurance as well as the risks of not having it.

An article that he wrote back in 2013 still rings very true and it provides an interesting view of the matter from a veterinarian's perspective that many of us have probably never considered before. We at Paws In Need urge all pet owners to sign up for pet insurance in order to lighten the stress of finances in an emergency. Heat and Unattended Pets In Your Car!

With summer come the high temperatures, but it does not necessarily need to reach the triple digits to put your pet at risk when left unattended in a car. **And it could land you in jail!**

Penal Code 597.7 PC Leaving a Pet in an Unattended Car

This California statute provides that no person shall leave or confine an animal in any unattended motor vehicle under conditions that endanger the health or well-being of an animal due to heat, cold, lack of adequate ventilation, or lack of food or water, or other circumstances that could reasonably be expected to cause suffering, disability, or death to the animal. In 2016, rescue provisions were added that allows a person to remove an animal in danger from a vehicle provided he or she meets several criteria listed in the law. A first conviction for violation of this section is punishable by a fine not exceeding \$100 per animal. If the animal suffers great bodily injury, a violation of this section is punishable by a fine not exceeding \$500, imprisonment in a county jail not exceeding six months, or by both a fine and imprisonment. Penalty enhancements are provided for subsequent convictions.

An independent study found that cracking the windows had very little effect on the temperature rise inside the vehicle. This is definitely a situation where "love 'em and leave 'em" is a good thing. Please leave your pets at home when you can...they'll be safe and happily waiting for you to come home.


